Is MVCS a good fit for my family?

Full-Time Middle and High School

- ☐ Have priority enrollment in classes @ MVCS.
- ☐ Students take a full schedule of classes choosing from the full list of class type options for their grade (online class, independent study, a class at a D51 school, WCCC, or CMU).
- ☐ Attend classes as little as 2 days a week and up to 5 days a week, depending on grade and which classes are chosen.
- ☐ Time not spent in class is available for students to work on their studies in the way that fits their schedule and needs the best.

Middle School Part-Time

- ☐ Students attend math and English classes in a blended-learning format on Tuesdays and Thursdays with work completed at home on the other days. Students may substitute one class at the student's local D51 school for either math or English. This allows students to take other subjects like science or electives.
- ☐ Have access to assessments to track student progress and meet state reporting requirements.
- ☐ Have access to MVCS staff who specialize in homeschool support.

High School Part-Time

- ☐ Students schedule two classes at MVCS in a blended-learning format on Tuesdays and Thursdays, or they may substitute an online class, a class at a D51 school, WCCC, or CMU.
- ☐ Have access to assessments to track student progress and meet state reporting requirements.
- ☐ Have access to MVCS staff who specialize in homeschool support.

MESA VALLEY Community School

- MVCS is a District #51 charter school serving students in grades K-12. Grades K-6 are served with the Mesa Valley Enrichment Program (MVEP). Grades 6-12 are enrolled in MVCS.
- 6th graders may enroll in either the 6-12th grade blended learning classes or the elementary program, Mesa Valley Enrichment Program (MVEP). For more information, see the MVEP brochure.
- Parents who choose to enroll full-time are given the opportunity to have their children at home for some of the school week and in classes at MVCS or other locations for the rest of the week.
- Parents who choose to homeschool (and enroll part-time) are empowered to educate their own children with the assistance of MVCS.
- ❖ We utilize an à la carte approach to building a personalized schedule for each student which involves the parent, ensuring that the schedule makes sense for the student and family. MVCS on-site blended learning classes provide the backbone of student schedules, but parents may also opt for their child to fill in their schedule with online classes, independent study, crossover classes at traditional District 51 schools, or concurrent classes at WCCC or CMU.
- MVCS serves the entire spectrum of special needs from struggling students to gifted and talented.
- The small school size allows every student to get the attention he or she deserves.
- Students are helped to make the transition from high school to college or career.


Vision

Middle School

Through both programs, we encourage students to be active participants in their own education and apply their learning to daily life, meaningful employment, and further studies.

High School
